### Association Successful in Having Legislation Changed

This hearing resulted in an OMB directive to rewrite the offending legislation in a form acceptable to all parties concerned, a significant victory for our members rights over the forces of municipal abstrus-tionism.

Closely related to the above, your attention is drawn to the sterling work performed by the Standards Committee over the years with both Residential and Commercial Standards published and now, in fact about due for their first revision. 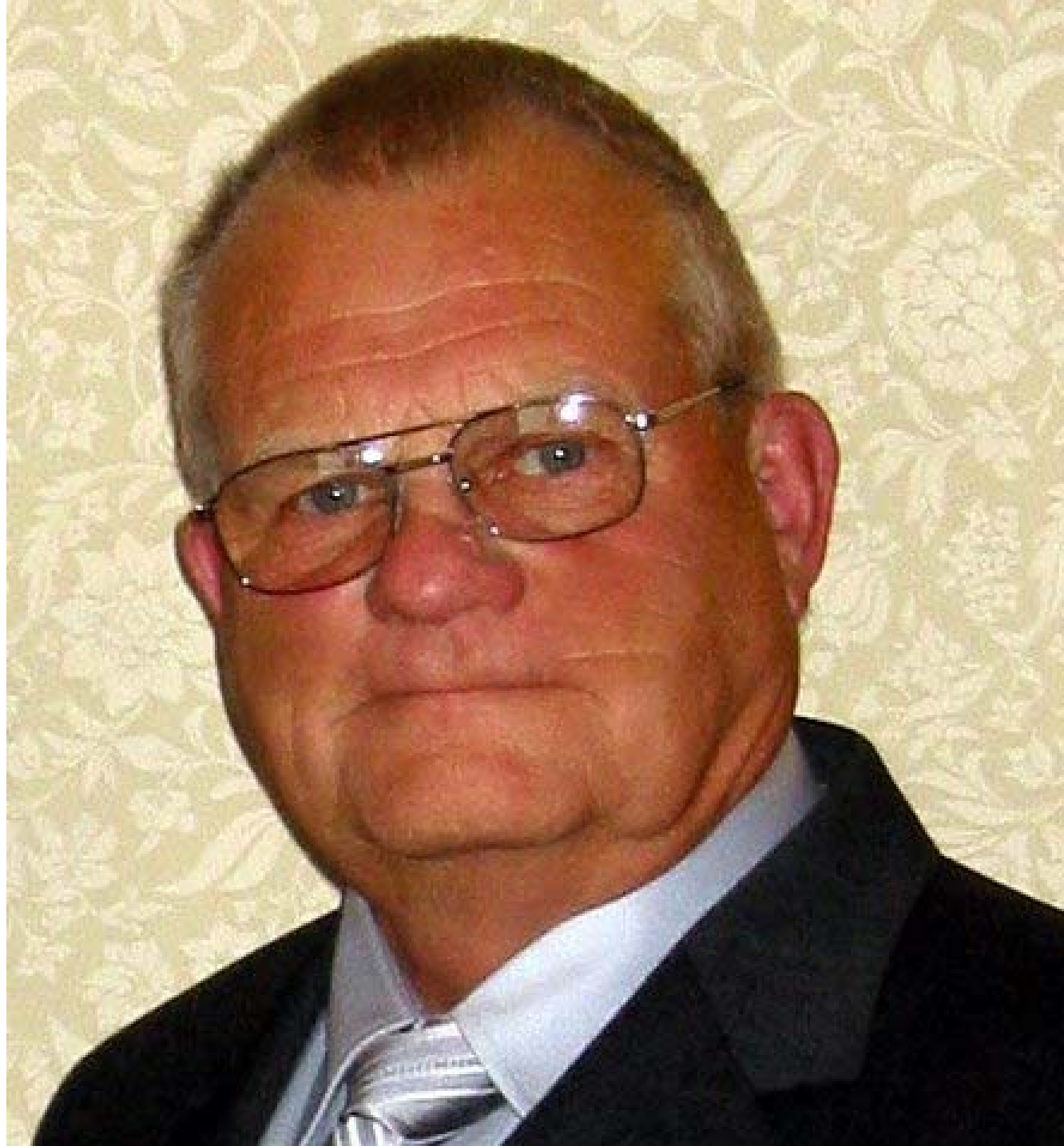

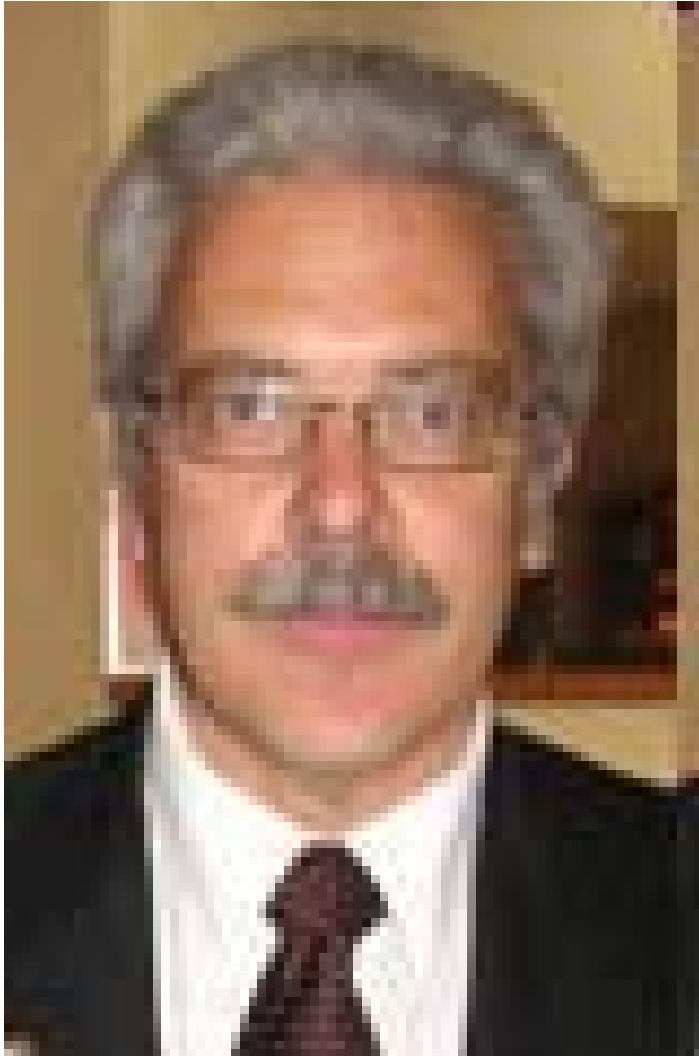
