Association Successful in Having Legislation Changed

In connection with authoritarian regulations deemed restrictive to the pool industry, please note the vigorous protest lodged against the Village of Forest Hill by a committee of three OSPA members at the Ontario Municipal Board's chambers last summer. This hearing resulted in an OMB directive to rewrite the offending legislation in a form acceptable to all parties concerned, a significant victory for our members rights over the forces of municipal abstructionism.
